The Strait Regional Centre for Education provides free all-gender care products in all schools with Grades 5 to 12 students. These products are located in all female and all-gender washrooms.

REMINDERS

- Parents of Elementary students are encouraged to keep an extra set of clothes in their child(ren)s school bag incase they get wet during the school day. This elimanates the need for phone calls home for dry clothes.
- Please continue to be mindful of our Safe Arrival Policy for students from P-6. You should have your child excused by 9:15am if they aren't attending school each day. If the school is not notified and we are unable to reach a parent/guardian the RCMP will be contacted to ensure the safety of the student.
- Please remember to return to the school the following signed forms as soon as possible:
 - 1. Registration Form
 - 2. Consent for Publication of Student Personal Information and Student Work Form
 - 3. Canada's Anti-Spam Legislation Form
 - 4. Permission to Leave School Grounds (Gr. 7-12)
- Parents/guardians entering the school are asked to sign in at the office. Parents are not permitted to go directly to their child/ren's classroom. If you need to see your child, the secretary will call the student to the office.
- Students should not be making calls or texting during instructional time. We ask that parents reinforce responsible use at home and know that the only time 7-12s should be using and receiving texts/calls is at recess (10:15-10:30am) and lunch (12:15pm-1pm).
- After school arrangements should be noted in the student's communication journal. Calling or emailing the office with instructions should only happen in **emergency** situations.
- IECA is a scent and fragrance-free school. Please encourage students to adhere to this.

School Photographer Services



As part of our contract with LifeTouch Photography and our school will be providing them with student names, grade, and provincial student ID # which they require to provide the service. The photographer is required to permanently delete all student information once the contract agreement has been fulfilled.

Information Sharing Agreement with Department of Health and Wellness

Annually, students across Nova Scotia are offered services delivered by Public Health including the Grade 7 School Immunization Program, Pre-school Screening, Enhanced Vision Screening Program, and the Fluoride Mouth rinse Program. Public Health works with the education system to distribute information about these programs and to obtain consent for student participation.

Occasionally, Public Health practitioners may need to contact parents/guardians of students where consent information is incomplete or unclear, or when a consent form has not been returned. Public Health will not contact you if you have signed a consent form indicating you do not wish to have your child participate in one of these programs. The Strait Regional Centre for Education takes its responsibility for the protection of personal student and family information seriously and will share limited information such as names of parents/guardians and students and parent email addresses with Public Health for the purposes of operating these public health services for students.

All Regional Centre's for Education in Nova Scotia share certain personal information about students and parents/guardians with the Department of Health and Wellness, for the purposes of operating these programs. This information sharing is required by the Public Health Protection Act and is permitted by the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy (FOIPOP) Act and an Information Sharing Agreement signed by the Regional Centre.

Please contact your local public health office if you have any questions about these public health programs. If you have any questions about how your information is shared, please feel free to contact your respective school or our Regional Centre's Information Access and Privacy Manager at 902-625-2191.

Notice to Families when hosting public events – e.g., sporting events/competitions, Holiday concerts, etc.

Please note from time to time our school will host public events like sporting events, competitions, and concerts. As a public event, it is reasonable to expect photographs and audio/video/digital recordings may be taken by those in attendance. Therefore, privacy cannot be expected. When events are public, it is reasonable to expect photographs and/or taping will be taken by spectators, media, and schools.

We understand you may wish to record your child at this event. Please be respectful of other students' and family's privacy when recording your child during the event.

Notice to Families Regarding School-Based Communications

As we begin another school year, I would like to share a reminder with our students and families regarding school communications.

As part of efforts to establish and maintain open communication with our students and families, our school uses several communication platforms, including print, online and social media, to regularly share information with our families and school community. These platforms include monthly school newsletter/calendar, school website, Twitter, Facebook group, and direct email and text alerts to parents and guardians using School Messenger.]

In addition, our practice is to share information on situations that require emergency response from EHS and/or the RCMP, as needed. Currently, there are plans involving individual students who may require a medical response. These specific incidents involving individual students will be addressed directly with the family of the student and no school-wide notification notice will be issued.

When necessary, serious incidents that impact multiple students and the school community broadly, including those that escalate through broad sharing on social media, will continue to be communicated directly to students and families through a notification issued by the school.

School Insurance Program

Every eligible child attending public school in Nova Scotia is automatically insured by the School Insurance Program's Basic Plan student accident coverage. This coverage is provided without deductible **and** at no cost. Basic Plan coverage can cover things such as physiotherapy, dental and medical equipment expenses, up to policy limits.

However, if parents/guardians wish to purchase additional coverage, the Gold Plan increases the time that your child is covered to 24/7 including summer vacations. Many of the specific loss accident payments are triple those of the Basic Plan. Please visit <u>www.sip.ca</u> for more information.

Notice to Families

Information Sharing Agreement with Chief Electoral Officer of Nova Scotia

In accordance with Sections 42(4), 42A and 43(5) of the *Elections Act*, the Chief Electoral Officer of Nova Scotia is authorized to gather and maintain information about 16- and 17-year-olds who would qualify as electors when they become 18 years of age. In addition, it authorizes for Elections Nova Scotia to be provided the personal information held by a public body as required to create, revise, or update the Register of Electors. The Register of Electors is a database of Nova Scotians who are qualified to vote in provincial elections.

An Information Sharing Agreement signed by the Strait Regional Centre for Education (SRCE) with the Chief Electoral Officer of Nova Scotia authorizes the SRCE to share, on an annual basis, information about 16- and 17-year-old students directly with Elections Nova Scotia for the sole purpose of adding them to the electoral list when they become eligible at the age of 18. The specific information to be shared includes student ID, school name, student's full name, gender, date of birth, mailing address, civic address and indicates if a student is currently enrolled in school.

Elections Nova Scotia is subject to the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy (FOIPOP) Act and collects information under this agreement for electoral purposes only. Please note that as students reach 18 years of age and are added to the Register of Electors, they may correct and/or update their information and/or opt out of the registry at that time if they wish by application to the Elections Nova Scotia Office.


